



#### **Group Review 2019 - Assistant Group Scout Leaders Report**

The Cestrian Scout Group has been fairly stable number wise over the last year. Our numbers from last year have increased slightly from 82 to 91 young people. We also have 17 full time leaders and 8 Young Leaders. As of June we have 26 Beaver Scouts, 36 Cub Scouts and 26 Scouts. Unfortunately due to other pressures or activities we have also lost a few young people from all sections.

We have 8 Young Leaders working with all sections. Hopefully they will take on full Leadership roles once they reach eighteen. I would like to welcome Harry Jupp-Catt who has taken on the role as Assistant Scout Leader.

Amongst his other roles as Assistant Cub Scout Leader and future District Youth Commissioner, Brandon Hone has also completed his Wood badge training for the role of Assistant Beaver Scout Leader. Well done and thank you.

We still have a small waiting list of children that wish to join the Group, mostly in the Beaver age group, 6 to 8 yrs. As we have several Leaders helping with the Beaver Colony we have increased the Colony size to 26 which has reduced our waiting list a little bit. We have had several enquiries which has resulted in young people directly joining our Cub Packs and Scout Troop.

Our intention to join list, i.e. those that wish to join but are not old enough, is currently at 47 with new ones being added almost daily. It is encouraging that parents still feel that Scouting is a youth movement that they wish their child to join but we still need adult help to make it flourish. If you could help or wish to know more please speak to one of the Leadership Team.

I have continued to assist with the Beaver Scout Section and with our very keen leaders, Kristy Collins, Brandon Hone and Sharron James who are doing a wonderful job with quite a keen age group. Under their leadership there have been quite a few Beavers that have gained their Bronze Award this year. Kristy is ably assisted by two Young Leaders Isacc and Cara and also Ben who is completing the service part of his DofE Bronze Award. Thanks to Bradney who helped us for quite some time but now having reached 18 has decided to continue with his further education.

I also help run Paddle Power Kayaking courses for the District on the River Dee during the summer months, and I was pleased to see some of our Scouts taking part and have achieved their Paddle Sports passport and Canoeist Badge.

Other Group activities during 2018/2019 have included adult support and cast members for the Chester Gang Show, supporting the Jamboree On The Air weekend in October by running various communications based activities. Unfortunately we didn't run our annual plant sale as we couldn't find a new coordinator.

Maintenance of the building is always ongoing and there are always small issues that need fixing. There are still a number of other projects that we are considering, e.g. sorting out the storage container, repairing the front entrance etc. If you could help with any of these projects or have any special skills i.e. joinery, building etc. please let me know.

A few thank you's; To Peter Bulmer and Kath Lloyd from the Parish Council who along with Denise Huxley, David Broady and myself helped produce an addendum to our current lease to acknowledge the change in the Group's name and sort out ownership of the car park. Hopefully issues with the ownership of the drains have finally been resolved.

Also to Andy and Chris Hunt of Bro Build who, at no charge, repaired the ceiling panels and the broken tiles in the boys toilet.

Last year I applied for Gift Aid from HMRC which resulted in a refund of £2372 and hopefully by this review I will have submitted this years claim . Thank you to all of the parents who have signed and returned the gift aid form. By paying your subs each term this has helped enormously in the collation of the information required by HMRC. If you or your spouse/partner pay tax and haven't returned your form we encourage you to do so. The application to HMRC is quite easy although time consuming but there is a good reward at the end of the process. Returning the subs payment slips each term helps considerably with the Gift Aid application and also essential in making the Treasurer, job a little easier consolidating the accounts.

The Group is registered with the website <a href="www.easyfundraising.org.uk">www.easyfundraising.org.uk</a> If you purchase goods online and register yourselves as a supporter of the Cestrian Scout Group then providing you order goods via the easyfundraising site, we get a bit of commission. It doesn't cost anything to use but we could receive a lot of easy money.

The new Group website, started seven years ago, can be accessed by using the URL <a href="www.cestrianscouts.org.uk">www.cestrianscouts.org.uk</a> There are links to Scout District, County and National websites. I would be grateful for any feedback relating to the presentation and content. We do have a diary page of main Group activities and a page showing hall bookings. Our hall is available for hire for children's parties and other functions. We also have a Group Facebook page

Finally I would like to thank all the other Leaders, Executive Committee Members and occasional helpers who support all of our young people. As the Group's Training Advisor I would like to thank all that have either completed their training or continuing with their training.

Many congratulations to Keith Harding, Group Scout Leader, for receiving the Scout Association's Silver Acorn. Also to Brandon Hone who has been presented with his DofE Gold Award and has completed the Queen Scout Award, the highest award in Scouting and to Chris Huxley - Clowes for gaining the Chiefs Scout's Commendation For Good Services.

If you have any queries or questions about any of the comments made above or wish to volunteer in any way to support the Group, please contact me or any of the team. We would welcome any parent to come and join our small Executive Committee or form a supporters group to help on an occasional basis with fund raising, HQ and equipment maintenance etc.

This year we are looking forward to another District Camp at Talton Park. Also supporting Alec Stokes who will be part of the International Service Team for the World Scout Jamboree in the USA this year.
